

Identify and promote the need for sustainable funding for the NARR and radiation readiness programs at the state and local level

Establish, maintain, and expand the NARR by building coalitions

Champion effective approaches to strengthening radiation readiness

Serve as the collective voice of radiation public health readiness

Quantify and secure funding to support the NARR's mission, priorities and objectives

Track and provide comment on relevant national policy matters


